That the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to execute the Caledon Council Golf Tournament 2019 primary recipient grant agreement as it relates to the primary recipient's grant application and the funding approved by Council, subject to any technical changes as may be required;

That the revised 2018 CCCGT Financial Statements reflective of an additional \$2,200 related to the 2018 tournament pledges collected in January 2019, attached as Schedule C and Schedule D to Committee Report 2019-1, be approved;

That the Treasurer be authorized to issue secondary grants to the organizations in the amounts listed in Schedule B to Committee Report 2019-1 as part of the Caledon Council Community Golf Tournament 2018 Secondary Grants; and

That \$2,000 from the remaining 2018 Golf Tournament Funds be disbursed as The Doug and Doreen Beffort Legacy Scholarship Awards to recipients approved by Council in Confidential Committee Report 2019-2.

REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

- The 2018 CCCGT Financials outlined in staff report 2018-96, dated December 11, 2018, have been revised as shown on Schedule C and D to include an additional \$2,200 of pledge revenue that was received. The additional revenue as per staff report 2018-96 was allocated:
 - o 75% (\$1,650) to the 2018 Primary Grant Recipient, Raising the Roof
 - o 25% (\$550) to the grants to be distributed in 2019
- Schedule A, outlines the 2019 primary grant applications. The CCCGT committee will select a recipient to be the 2019 CCCGT primary grant recipient
- Schedule B, outlines the 2018 secondary grant CCCGT evaluation committee recommendations



DISCUSSION

Revised 2018 CCCGT Financial Statements

The financials outlined in staff report 2018-96, dated December 11, 2018 identified the following:

As noted in the December 11, 2018 report:

- the revenues and net remaining for secondary CCCGT grant recipients excluded \$10,000 of sponsorship pledges from various organizations but had not yet been received;
- Strategic Initiatives staff believed there was a high probability that some of these pledges will be collected; and that
- If any of the outstanding of the (\$10,000) pledges related to the 2018 CCCGT was collected by January 31, 2019:
 - 1) the funds would be included in revised 2018 CCCGT financials:
 - 2) 75% of the additional funds collected by January 31, 2019 be provided to the (2018) primary grant recipient, Raising the Roof; and that
 - 3) 25% of the additional funds collected by January 31, 2019 be allocated to the secondary CCCGT grant program.

As of January 31, 2019, \$2,200 of additional sponsorship revenue related to the 2018 CCCGT was collected. As approved by Council in staff report 2018-96:

- 1) \$1,650 (or 75%) of the additional funds collected will be provided to the 2018 Primary Grant recipient, Raising the Roof; and the remaining
- 2) \$550 (or 25%) of the additional funds collected has been allocated for secondary CCCGT grant recipients, related to the 2018 CCCGT.

In 2018, Raising the Roof was selected as the primary recipient and received \$64,002. With the additional funds collected (noted above), the total funds allocated to Raising the Roof related to the 2018 CCCGT has increased to \$65,652 (=\$64,002+\$1,650) as per Schedule C

Similarly, with the additional funds collected (noted above), the funding available for the 2018 Secondary CCCGT grant program has increased, by \$550, to \$28,089 (\$21,334+\$550+\$6,205).



Committee Report 2019-01

The Caledon Council Community Golf Tournament (CCCGT) is an annual charity event that raises funds for non-profit organizations either located in Caledon, or providing services in Caledon. For the period 2004 to 2018 the CCCGT has donated a total of \$1,096,092 to community organizations as per schedule D.

Primary Applications

The grant application for the primary and secondary recipients for the 2019 golf tournament was made available on the Town's website at the beginning of December, with a submission deadline of February 3rd, 2019. The criteria indicated on the application form is that the preference is to award the Primary Grant to an applicant supporting community projects within Caledon and that applicants will be considered generally based on, but not limited to, the following criteria: non-profit organization, located in Caledon and/or provide services for Caledon residents; capital project in nature benefiting the community; detailed scope of the project and a plan to recognize the grant and Town. Organizations were made aware of the application through newspaper advertising, social media and email communication.

A list of all applications received for the primary recipient of the 2019 CCCGT is provided below for the CCCGT Committee to review and designate a primary recipient. Once the primary recipient has been designated, the CCCGT Committee will indicate the amount of net funds to be dedicated to the primary recipient. In the past, this has been done based upon the amount indicated on the primary recipient grant application, or a set percentage of net funds raised from the event. In 2018, the amount chosen was 75% of the net proceeds and in 2017, \$75,000 of the net proceeds was allocated as the primary grant.

All applications and supporting documents submitted by organizations are provided in Schedule A.

Once the primary recipient is chosen by the CCCGT committee, Staff will work with the primary grant recipient on a grant agreement outlining items including: overall project timeline, grant specified project timeline, additional fundraising details, schedule of payments, scope of project, expectation of project completion report etc. Staff recommend providing the Mayor and Clerk with authorization to execute the grant agreement to ensure timely distribution of funds to the primary recipient as approved by Council.

Secondary Applications

The grant application (as approved by the CCCGT committee in 2018) for the remaining funds from the 2018 golf tournament was made available on the website at the beginning of December, with a due date of February 3rd, 2019. Organizations were made aware of the application through newspaper advertising and email communication. The CCCGT grant review committee met in mid-February to review the applications and make funding recommendations using the criteria outlined in the grant guidelines which includes whether the projects:

- showcase the Town of Caledon;
- would benefit the community;
- are located in Caledon; and whether
- the organization has received other funding from the Town, and if partial funding is awarded would the project or program still proceed.



Committee Report 2019-01

The CCCGT grant review committee is comprised of staff from the Community Services Department (Recreation), Finance and Infrastructure Services Department (Finance), and Strategic Initiatives Department (Partnerships and Events).

Recommendations from the CCCGT grant evaluation committee for disbursement of the remaining 2018 Tournament funds, \$28,089 are provided in Schedule B. In total the CCCGT grant evaluation committee has recommended that the \$26,089 be distributed to 18 organizations across the Town.

It is preferred that grant recipients complete their project and submit all receipts to the Town by December 1st of the year in which they are awarded the grant. Any organizations that cannot meet the December 1st deadline will need to request an extension from the CCCGT grant evaluation committee. Any portion of the secondary grants that receipts have not been submitted for, the funds are allocated the following year to other qualifying organizations.

 - a) Purpose/Mission

The purpose of the organization is to provide compassionate and practical care in a temporary housing for women and their children in times of need. The individual programs will be designed based on the personal needs of the resident. The program will be collectively designed with an assigned coach that will support and guide the resident while at Victory House.

b) Goals and Objectives

The residents goals will be mutually created and monitored to ensure the resident is working toward an independent life style. The objective of the team at Victory House is to assist the women and their children to move back into the community with a healthier mindset and to assist the women to find appropriate employment. The overall plan is to engage our community to accept the responsibility of working with the team to make our Town of Caledon not just a place to live, but THE place to live. A Town of community involvement to benefit all who live here.

 Describe the purpose of the grant funding and/or scope of the project. If *Capital, explain how it will benefit the community.

The purpose of the grant funding is to assist with the cost of a new roof for the building. This would include removing the existing steel roofing and strapping, relocating existing trusses and supply and install 23 new 40' span trusses. Replace the strapping and install a new steel roof.

*Capital Expenditure – An appropriation of funds for a capital improvement project or asset. These are non-operating expenditures to acquire assets which will have a useful life greater than one year.

We would also like to use the grant funding to contribute to the cost for demolition and disposal of interior walls & ceiling in the building.

At this time nothing like this exists in Caledon although there is a great need for a temporary home that offers programs to assist women who have made the decision to move forward with their lives. This project will benefit the community by being the first of its kind while showing others that Caledon has residents that want to accept the responsibility to make our town the best town in Canada.

The Victory House is in the centre of Caledon and provides services for Caledon residents and is a capital project, which will benefit the community, not only with the services provided by the house but with the involvement of the community.

The timeline for the project is to have the roof replaced and the interior demolition completed within the 2019 fiscal year. The proposed start date is June 2019 and completion is December 30, 2019.

5. Please provide a list of all other sources of funding that contribute to your project/program.

The primary source of funding at this time is personal and community donations contributed through ongoing Fundraisers. The first major fundraiser was November 2018 where we raised \$47,000. At the event four community corporations have offered their donations in kind for other areas of need in the building.

At this time we have five fundraisers planned for 2019. Two will be major events contributing \$50,000 each and the other events will contribute up to \$5,000 each. All of the events are to raise awareness of Victory House and the need for this project in our community.

The leadership team is applying for grants from various organizations that will assist with the renovations and ongoing support of the house.

<u>Project:</u> To build an extension on the Great War Flying Museum hangar at Brampton-Caledon airport

1. Who we are

- ➤ The Great War Flying Museum (GWFM) is an all-volunteer organization with 60 members. It has been active at Brampton-Caledon Airport for almost 50 years.
- ➤ We are dedicated to inspiring a love of early aviation and respect for the men and women who participated in the world's first air war.
- > We maintain two buildings, an aircraft hangar and an artefact museum. The hangar is used to build and maintain a fleet of flying World War One reproduction aircraft.
- Annually we give air displays, tours, education and fun to over 4,000 visitors at our home base and from 40,000 to 50,000 viewers at off-site air shows and commemorations.
- ➤ Year round, 10 to 15 volunteers work 2 to 4 days a week. Pilots and ground crews augment that number during the summer flying season. On a fine summer evening or for an event, up to 40 volunteers participate.
- ➤ Our members include a high level of expertise across all our activities. And they are incredibly hard working. For example, 49 volunteers dedicated over 5,000 hours to the artefact museum renovation. Two years of renovation brought the museum up to standard as a special tourist attraction in Caledon.
- Our income is diversified and largely self-generated. Sources include annual events, air-displays, private funding, school tours, membership fees and at-the-door donations.
- In recent years, support has also come from the Royal Canadian Air Force Heritage Fund and the Town of Caledon.

2. Why the Great War Flying Museum matters

- •• Because we attract tourists from outside Caledon:
- Our visitor guest book contains names from 23 countries, 8 Canadian provinces and 48 Ontario towns.
- ➤ In 2017 and 2018 we flew in air shows from Gatineau, Quebec, to Selfridge, Michigan and, closer to home, across southern Ontario. Air display announcements encourage people to visit us at our home base. Flight-line display banners carry the Town of Caledon logo.

- ➤ In 2019, the GWFM planes are scheduled to fly at the Toronto waterfront CNE/Canadian International Air Show. Flight line announcements include our Caledon location.
- ➤ In 2019, GWFM will be featured in "Flight Festival", a new event at the CNE. GWFM exhibit banners carry the Caledon logo. Our display will include space for promotion by Town of Caledon and Headwaters Tourism.
- ➤ Many of our visitors come to Caledon specifically for our museum For example, in 2018:
 - We hosted the Canadian Aviation Artists Society annual conference. CAAs members came from across Canada and their widely promoted exhibition brought a number of visitors from the GTA.
 - o The family of Great War pilot, Richard Kraut came from Amsterdam, Holland, to see the progress on our Fokker D.VII "RK".
 - o Members of the Canadian Aviation Heritage magazine visited GWFM and wrote articles that appeared in two Canada-wide publications.
 - o Tour groups came from the Guelph, Georgetown, Oshawa and downtown Toronto.
- ➤ GWFM mounts displays at heritage events every year.
 - o In 2018, this included "Canada's 100 Days" events at Fort York, Toronto, and Fort Henry, Niagara-on-the-Lake and the Leaside celebration of the 100th anniversary of Canada's first Air Mail Flight.

•• Because we connect the local community to the airport:

- ➤ GWFM contributes to 4 to 6 community service group events per year. In 2018, these included the "One World" conference at Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints and Probus and Rotary Clubs in Palgrave, Brampton and Guelph.
- ➤ GWFM is an active participant in community initiatives such as the annual "Light Up The Runway" fundraiser for Bethel Hospice.
- ➤ We connect long-standing local families. For example, a current project in our history team is to identify the members of a newly acquired 1916 pilot's class photo, to research their careers, to connect to their descendants and to bring them together for an event at GWFM.
- ➤ GWFM partners with the Brampton Flying Club in the annual Brampton-Caledon Airport Day. 4,000 to 5,00 people per year have attended in 2016, 2017 and 2018.
- ➤ In 2018 GWFM had approximately>>>>>> recorded visits in addition to Airport Day. The majority are from the nearby Caledon, Brampton and Mississauga areas.
- ➤ We attract non-aviation visitors to Brampton-Caledon Airport, which fosters public support for the airport operation and patronage of the airport restaurant.
- We teach the large local population of new Canadians about Canada's proud history.

•• Because we are unique:

The Great War Flying Museum is the only organization in Canada that flies full scale World War One aircraft for the public.

- ➤ We are the only school field trip destination in the Region of Peel that focuses on the grade 10 curriculum unit on World War One.
- ➤ We preserve the artefacts, histories and memories of local WWI veterans. Every year we receive the papers and artefacts of Canadian airmen that would otherwise be discarded.
- Our website reach has brought visitors from Europe and Japan and research enquiries from around the world.
- ➤ We attract movie shoots. GWFM aircraft have appeared in productions as diverse as "The Aviator" starring Leonardo DiCaprio, which was filmed in California and the TV pilot "Bishop Girls" filmed at the GWFM hangar. In 2018 our aircraft were used in two movies, the Cinema

- Worldfest Official entry "Fantôme d'Argonne" and History Chanel Canada's program "100 Days to Victory" released on November 11, 2018.
- As the only living history museum in Caledon, we preserve our heritage and honour our veterans in a way that resonates with all our visitors. For many, the excitement and immediacy of our aircraft is their first introduction to our cultural heritage and to the world of aviation.

3. What the project will accomplish for the Great War Flying Museum

The renovation of our artefact museum has created measurable growth in public awareness of our site and in the enthusiasm of our volunteers (Note A). The hangar extension will continue the momentum as we enter our second half-century in Caledon.

Scope:

The planned hangar extension will provide space to:

- > Keep all our aircraft on site for public viewing during the summer months
- Continue aircraft construction and maintenance year round
- ➤ Offer public amenities such as gift shop sales and an accessible visitor washroom
- Upgrade our artefact and archival care (Note B)
- Provide safe on-site storage for aircraft materials including oil and paint
- > Accommodate bus-sized school groups
- ➤ Host an expanded roster of public events (Note C)
- Create dedicated routes to fire exits

The hangar extension is budgeted for approximately \$140,000. Of this \$40,000 is noted as being raised by GWFM from membership and business contribution. In January 2019, we will be launching a pledge campaign, first among our members and then to local supporters. As of November 1, 2018, well before the official start of this campaign, we have received \$23,000.00 in pledges. I am confident that GWFM can raise all necessary funds needed to complement the Town of Caledon's Golf Tournament Grant.

Rationale and measurement:

During the centennial of World War One, GWFM saw strong growth in visitor numbers and financial consolidation (Note D). In particular, air displays during Vimy Year enabled us to retire all our debts and to complete energy efficiency upgrades on our current hangar space (Note E). However, paid air displays dropped from 22 in 2017 to 10 in 2018. To maintain our programs after 2018, we need to be able to (1) Revitalize our air display program and (2) Develop diversified income streams.

- 1. Revitalize our air display program:
- ➤ GWFM's major outreach programming and income stream is our flying aircraft. Two more planes are required to maintain a viable presence at air-shows and commemorations.
 - o Another Allied aircraft is needed to mount a missing man formation at commemorations.
 - o A second German aircraft is needed to create an air-show mock dogfight. Now that our Fokker D.VII is flying, we need the space to maintain it in the main hangar.
- While extra hangar space can be rented elsewhere on the airport, this alternative means that
 Visitors see only part of our fleet

- Volunteers work in several locations, which degrades the camaraderie and effectiveness of their work
- o Financial resources used on rent do not support the sustainability of GWFM

2. Develop diversified income streams:

Records kept during 2017 and 2018 show that approximately 2/3 of our visitors came out for special events or organized tours. We will be focusing first on these areas since they attract such a large portion of our visitors.

Events

- ➤ An upgraded facility will:
 - Allow GWFM to offer larger scope events to build engagement with the public, provide a better visitor experience overall and make Brampton-Caledon Airport a destination for tourism.
 - o Encourage a higher percentage of Airport Day visitors to go through GWFM
 - o Accommodate an expanded event program. Our trial event in 2018, "Ground to Sky", held on July 15, suffered from over-hot weather and competition from other events. "Ground to Sky" 2019 will be held on Father's Day, June 16.

Tours

- ➤ During the winter months we are unable to tour more than 20 people at once without risking damage to the airplanes. The new layout in the expanded hangar will:
 - o Identify fire routes, which will also act as safe movement paths between airplanes
 - o Accommodate busload sized school groups of 50 students
 - o Accommodate wheel-chair groups such as the Sunnybrook Veterans

4. How the project will benefit the community of Caledon

The upgraded facility will give GWFM the capacity to expand the variety and reach of its public programs; programs that educate and inspire Caledon's visitors, residents and students.

- New programs will bring the world to Caledon by:
 - o Maintaining a second annual public event, "Ground to Sky" projected attendance 1,000
 - o Attracting media attention e.g. CBC TV Coverage at Ground to Sky 2018
 - o Attracting off-site promotion opportunities: e.g. as a result of our D.VII rebuild project, GWFM will be highlighted in a one-time "Flight Fest" at the CNE in 2019
 - o Becoming a hub for aviation interest groups and military museums in Peel
 - o Attracting the participation of living history museums from across Ontario (Note F)
- The expanded facility will enrich the lives of Caledon residents by:
 - o Hosting school field trips in history, science and social awareness (Note G).
 - o Keeping volunteer "seniors" active and engaged (Note H).
 - o Providing a rare opportunity for young volunteers to learn new skills. (Note I)
 - o Bringing more public participation and support to Brampton-Caledon Airport
 - o Providing safe-keeping for the tangible history of Caledon Area residents (Note J).

For almost half a century The Great War Flying Museum has honoured our veterans and inspired aviation enthusiasts. However, the timeworn phrase "best kept secret" has all too often applied. The planned hangar expansion will enable us to enter our second half-century as a vibrant and unique member of Caledon's cultural and tourism network.

Notes:


A. Measurable growth: In 2012, the curator's report cited 260 visitors to the artifact museum. In 2018 this number had grown to over 3,000. Before the renovation, the artefact museum was rarely opened to the public because of the condition of its displays. Now, GWFM members proudly urge all our visitors to visit it. Similarly, in the first decade of the 21st century, GWFM was featured in the media 1 or 2 times per year. Now, in addition to a very active social media following, we get 6 to 8 magazine articles, newspaper spots and TV news coverage each year.

- B. At present GWFM has no on-site storage space so artefact information and archives are stored in several places leading to possible loss and neglect. The new addition sets aside a room for office work and archive storage.
- C. For example: On Fathers Day, 2019, an expanded "Ground To Sky" will lead off the centennial of "Victory Year". This heritage and re-enactors event will include the public "inaugural flight" of our Fokker D.VII. Billy Bishop and William Barker flew D.VIIs at the 1919 Toronto CNE Victory Year celebrations.
- D. Visitor numbers: Attendance numbers have grown from less than 3,500 visits recorded in 2013 to over 7,000 in Vimy Year (2017).

Financial consolidation: Revenue air displays increased from 14 in 2014 to 22 in Vimy Year: At the door donations increased by 20%. The following year, air display revenue fell from \$35,280 in 2017 to \$17,200 in 2018. Event revenue fell from \$17,300 in 2017 to \$11,000 in 2018. 2017 was a notably good year, in part because of the never-to-be-controlled good weather and in part because of a number of small Vimy Year events. While event and air display revenue decreased during 2018 at-the-door numbers and donations have remained steady for non-event days. It appears that several years of higher media and tourism promotion has resulted in GWFM becoming better known as a local day-trip destination.

- E. Debt retirement: Six years ago, GWFM acquired a small hangar on Brampton-Caledon Airport for aircraft storage. This cost was paid off in early 2018. Hangar upgrades: Over the last 4 years the entire main hangar has been upgraded from an environment with snowdrifts under the workbenches and inadequate lighting. The final piece of the work was done in October 2018 when R40 insulation was installed in the hangar ceiling.
- F. One outside military heritage group came to GWFM each year up to 2016. In 2017 we attracted 3 military heritage groups. For 2019, we have 6 heritage groups scheduled.
- G. In 2018, GWFM gave 15 school tours for a total of 526 students. We also gave fly-pasts for two school commemorative occasions.
- H. Great War Flying Museum members participate in the skilled work and social atmosphere at the hangar year round. Over 20 members work at the museum regularly 3 to 4 days per week. Over 50 members contribute their time from 5 to 25 times a year.
- I. In the spring of 2018, GWFM provided a secondary school work placement program for a student who has been volunteering with us. As a result, he was accepted to the college of his choice for the Aircraft Mechanical Engineers program. GWFM mechanics and pilots are a treasured source of knowledge that they willingly pass on to younger generations.

J. The artefact collection at GWFM is the result of donations by many individuals. They wish to see public recognition for the part their family members have played in Canada's history and to contribute to a collection that keeps that history alive and accessible. In 2018, alone, GWFM was given items for 20 accession files. Individual files include up to 20 objects each including medals, armament and memorabilia.

- 2. Organization's Mandate?
 - a) Purpose/Mission

The Meaghan Zaremba Music Room ("MZMR") provides music lessons as therapy to young adults with physical, mental and emotional challenges. The Program assists in relieving conditions associated with these challenges through music instruction. It promotes calm and relaxing behaviour for people with autism, down syndrome, spinal injuries, brain injuries, and all special needs situations.

In 2018, the MZMR became incorporated as a not-for-profit corporation and is governed by an experienced Board of Directors.(attached)

b) Goals and Objectives

The goals and objectives of our corporation is to sponsor physically and/or mentally challenged individuals to obtain tutored music instruction year-round. Currently, and since 2013, the Program has been operated at Tisho's Music Academy. Since its inception, funds have been derived from sponsoring corporations, service clubs, grants and individual donors. Individuals come from SNAPSO (outline), BCCL (outline), VITA Community Living, and White Birch Special Needs. At present, the Program operates 3 days per week and on average supports approximately 80 individuals per month, and has a waiting list of more than 20 clients, including persons from St. Michael's Secondary School.

 Describe the purpose of the grant funding and/or scope of the project. If *Capital, explain how it will benefit the community.

*Capital Expenditure – An appropriation of funds for a capital improvement project or asset. These are non-operating expenditures to acquire assets which will have a useful life greater than one year. If successful in receiving the Grant, 100% of the funds will be used to support the needs of our challenged individuals by utilizing music instruction. During 2018, the Program has grown to more than 100 individuals per month however, there was no funding so that the program can grow. For this reason, the program is on hold and with a waiting list, until such time as the proper equipment and instruments can be purchased. Once the MZMR is properly equipped, the room can operate 5 days per week and be able to meet demand by providing this service to all the special needs individuals in Caledon.

With an annual budget of \$41,000.00 the Program requires additional financial resources to support these critical services.



**PLEASE ADD TO SCHEDULE A - GOALS & OBJECTIVES

Each music instruction is conducted by qualified music professionals. The group sessions range from 6 to 10 participants. Each organization brings along their own caregivers who re present throughout the class. The program is designed to engage all the participants in playing and sharing all musical instruments, dance through rhythm and movement, karaoke, and group jam sessions. The music teachers consistently encourage participation with each category by spending personal time with each individual. Support, encouragement and praise is the key to achieving the success of each class.

It is important for Council to note and understand, that this is a very difficult program to explain on paper. Answering all the questions required, does not do it justice, and to quote Carlo Summaria in his attached support letter, "I wish I could attach a video to my letter." Without being present and viewing the class, the impact, the joy, the happiness, but most important, the benefits, it is extremely hard to put into words. Things are not always always that black and white. For example, there is no place for us to show you how:

- a/ a young woman who never spoke a word in 20 years is now talking in her music classes
- b/ a young man who was born mute, counts from 1 to 4, then starts to play his drums
- c/ 2 young adults in wheelchairs suddently stand up and begin to dance to the music
- d/ all the participants are now reading music notes as part of the academics we teach
- e/ several individuals with autism & ADHD are completely hypnotized by the classical live music played on the piano by the teachers.

There are so many more examples but the point that needs to be taken is that this is not just an ordinary program of banging on instruments and dancing to music. There is structure and discipline, where much needed learning tools are crucial to the success of the program. There is not a single person that attends the MZMR that is not capable of learning. And this is our primary approach. Everyone can learn and heal with the magic of music. We ask you to look beyond the black and white and try to understand what this program does, and what the funding will do for it's future.

The Caledon Fair occupies an 18 acre parcel in Caledon Village on Hurontario St. On that property are several structures, including a pavilion, an exhibits hall (a historical building), a public toilet block provided by the Town of Caledon, and an office trailer. The office trailer is deteriorating, having been in this location for many years, and it is both leaky, and tilting on its chassis. The Caledon Agricultural Society needs a new office space, and would like to erect one which is both attractive and in keeping with the long history of the Fair, and which will provide better utility and a long future life. The building does not need a full and deep foundation, as, in all likelihood it will be a 3 season structure not meant for use in the winter, so that a crawl space foundation or pole barn type foundation would be acceptable. Having the structure closer to ground level would also provide better accessibility, as it is currently on transport trailer running gear, and requires entry by way of stairs. As a charitable organization, the Society is not permitted to accumulate the funds needed for such a construction over a lenthy period of time. While we hope to apply for a Trillium Grant to help out with this construction, this is a lengthy process with no guarantee of success.
