PRESENTATION

Jesse DeJager, Manager, Capital Projects and Assets, Credit Valley Conservation Authority, provided a presentation regarding the Belfountain Conservation Area Phase I – Heritage Permit Scope. Mr. DeJager outlined the history of the property and highlighted key historical features of the Belfountain Conservation Area. He provided an overview of the planning process to date and went over the main objectives of the project, to protect, conserve, connect, sustain and experience the Belfountain Conservation Area. Mr. DeJager reviewed the restoration projects to be implemented through Phase I, including the fountain, remnant swimming pool, Belfountain dam, removal of head pond and construction of a new natural river channel and fox folly. He concluded the presentation by highlighting the implementation timeline for Phase I.

Chair Crease thanked Mr. DeJager for the presentation.

UPDATES

Heritage Resource Office

a) Heritage Grant Program

S. Parish informed the Committee that eleven (11) applications were received for properties that met the qualifying criteria for the Spring Heritage Property Grant Program. She advised that staff are recommending the approval of nine (9) applications totaling \$27, 711.07 in grant funding.

b) Pinkney House - 17923 Shaw's Creek Road, Ward 1

J. LeForestier asked questions regarding the maintenance and preservation of the Pinkney House.

S. Drummond informed the Committee that the house is not owned by the Town and is located on private property. Ms. Drummond advised the Committee that the Ontario Heritage Act includes provisions that allow municipalities to enact an enhanced Property Standards By-law to protect structures with historical designations. She advised that staff are preparing an amendment to the Town’s Property Standards By-law that will be presented to Council later this year.
