Parking Control – 4 part time Officers







Service Request Volumes – By-law




File Closure Rate

Parking Enforcement Challenges

- Changes in family composition resulting in more vehicles per household
- Built form does not provide enough parking capacity in many households
- Secondary dwelling units (i.e., basement apartments) increasing in volume
- Different expectations by residents
- Strict enforcement vs. non-enforcement
- Rural issues different than urban issues
- Scenic areas vs. street congestion



Issues for consideration

- Previous standards and approaches do not work in today's world
- Enforcement is not a solution to the parking issues
- Council direction needed re: parking policies
 - On-street parking
 - Built form standards (Zoning By-law)
