

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF CALEDON

BY-LAW NO. 2023-019

A by-law to amend By-law 2022-035, a by-law to grant assistance to eligible property owners who are older adults or persons with disabilities

WHEREAS Subsection 365(1) of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "*Act*"), authorizes a local municipality to pass a by-law to provide for the cancellation, reduction or refund of taxes for eligible property Owners whose taxes are considered by Council to be unduly burdensome, as defined in the by-law;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Caledon shall give notice to the Regional Municipality of Peel in accordance with Subsection 365(2) of the Act, of the fact that it has passed a by-law in accordance with Subsection 365(1) of the Act;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Caledon deems it desirable and in the public interest to enact such a by-law;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Caledon deems it desirable to increase the amount of grant assistance provided to persons eligible under Town of Caledon By-law;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Caledon ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That section 4 of By-law 2022-035 be deleted and replaced with the following:
 4. Upon receipt of an application submitted in accordance with Sections 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of this by-law, the Treasurer is authorized and directed to provide eligible owners(s) of eligible property located within the geographic boundaries of the Town of Caledon a tax rebate of one thousand and fifty dollars (\$1,050.00) in respect of real property taxes imposed by the Town on the eligible property in respect of which the tax rebate is claimed.
2. This by-law shall come into force and take effect March 29, 2023.
