- is located in Caledon and/or provides services for Caledon residents
- is a capital project in nature benefitting the community
- provides a detailed scope of the project, and
- provides a plan to recognize the grant and the Town.


# **Secondary Recipients**

Preference will be given to groups or organizations that are aligned with the following criteria:

# **Funding Availability**

- Foundations (fundraisers for registered charities are permitted)
- Groups or organizations of a religious nature (religious groups hosting an event or activity for the community that is non-denominational in nature are eligible)

- Hospitals, hospital foundations and hospital auxiliary groups or agencies
- Organizations not in good financial standing with the Town of Caledon or in litigation with the Town
- Local boards of the Town of Caledon

\*Only organizations in adherence with the requirements of the Ontario Government, including the Ontario Human Rights Code are eligible for funding through the CCCGT Grant Program.

# **Grant Requirements**

Organizations applying for a grant must provide and/or ensure the following information to the Town of Caledon:

- Complete and submit an official CCCGT Grant Application form in accordance with guidelines and deadlines.
- An organization applying for multiple grants must complete an application form for each separate funding request.

# **Requirements after Approval**

- All grant recipient organizations will be required to recognize Town of Caledon CCCGT Grant contributions by:
  - Recognizing the Town's grant contribution at the organization's event or activity.
     Town of Caledon property flags are available for the organization if they wish to display at the event.
  - Acknowledging of funding on all promotional material. (If the Town of Caledon logo is used, approval must be obtained from the Town's General Manager, Strategic Initiatives prior to printing of the promotional material)
- It is preferred that secondary grant recipients submit proof of payment to the Town by December 1 of the year in which they are awarded the grant to receive their grant funding.



- Primary grant recipient will require a grant agreement, outlining items including: overall

These are non-operating expenditures to acquire assets which will have a useful life greater than one year. The pandemic has had a significant impact on the CCB. Provincial restrictions prevented the band from gathering to rehearse and perform, resulting in the loss of our main source of revenue. We are excited to physically come together again but are faced with added costs associated with the pandemic such as purchasing sneeze shields, PPE and sanitizing supplies. In addition - we are multigenerational and several of our members are in the highly vulnerable category; not yet ready to return to band or attend concerts in person.. Therefore we find ourselves in a situation where we need to source and recruit new players for the band.

The purpose of funding leads directly to growth and continuuing to thrive and entertain in Caledon; attracting new members to the band and appealing to wider audiences. Our biggest NEEDS to accomplish this are:

\*\*\*Investing in new music scores. The average music score costs \$150 [one piece]. A regular concert consists of 7 - 12 pieces. While we have a vast music library of historical and traditional variety; In order to keep up with the times, attract new players and appeal to a wider community audience, it is necessary to invest in new musical scores, selections that are popular, written by living composers and relevant to this era. [We would like to purchase 5 new scores immediately 5x 150 = \$750]

The Caledon Butterflyway team plan to canvas the designated homes on these streets with information on the project and sign-up participants or ask for feedback on why they do not wish to participate. A "planting bee" will occur with the native plants and seeds and each participating home would be provided a lawn sign showing that they are part of the corridor project.

The Caledon Butterflyway team will follow-up during the season to monitor planting success and monitor the pollinators being reported in the iNaturalist application. A summary of the pilot will be provided as to what worked or didn't and then this model could be applied to different areas in Caledon in the future.


