PROCEDURAL PROCESS:

In accordance with Section 8.10.1 of the Procedure By-law, as amended, the Clerk shall place deemed completed notices of motions on the specified relevant meeting agenda as a motion for Council or Committee consideration.

MOTION:

Whereas the Town of Caledon recognizes the importance of community policing, ensuring police agencies are accessible and visible within our community; and

Whereas relocating of the current OPP Police Community Station from 14111 Highway 50 to a central downtown Bolton location will improve accessibility for residents, businesses, and visitors, ensuring faster response times and increasing public interaction with community officers; and

Whereas a downtown office presence enhances visibility, fosters community trust, and strengthens partnerships between law enforcement and local stakeholders; and

Whereas exploring a location in Ward 2, particularly within emerging high-density neighbourhoods, ensures that policing infrastructure keeps pace with urban development, maintaining safety and service standards for growing communities; and

Whereas these strategic moves support a more community-focused approach, allowing police services to better engage with diverse populations and address neighbourhood-specific concerns more effectively;

Now therefore be it resolved that Council approve the relocation initiative of the OPP Community Substation (Bolton) to a downtown Bolton location, to be selected in consultation with the OPP, with associated costs to be covered through the facility maintenance budget; and

That staff be directed to initiate site assessments and stakeholder consultations for a future Ward 2 location, particularly within high-density residential zones, in order to proactively plan for anticipated population growth and community safety needs, and report back to Council for inclusion in the 2027 budget.
